## Code for Sustainable Homes (storage of bicycles within a shed) – CSH 680

This building can be supplied in the required specification to meet the criteria for multiple bicycle storage within the Code for Sustainable Homes Technical Guide 2010 and corresponding Secured by Design New Homes 2010 documentation (clause 35).

Up to two credits can be obtained for the provision of cycle storage facilities.

To conform the building must be securely fixed down to a concrete foundation – fixings are supplied for this purpose.

The building meets or exceeds the minimum storage area required to store cycles on the floor which includes space to allow cycles to be moved independently of one another – in addition the building also conforms to the additional space required for garden tool storage (one square metre).

This version CSH 680 includes the following.

- 1. Sold Secure Silver certified padlock with stainless steel hasp (coach bolted through the door).
- 2. Sold Secure Silver certified ground anchor.
- 3. Adjustable heavy duty plastic cycle stands are provided for each bicycle.
